#### Pastor's Pen: April Fool

The time for jokes and jesting is almost upon us. April Fools' Day is just around the corner. No one knows for sure the origins of this special day. Some have suggested that changing from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar in the 1500s created some confusion concerning the beginning of the new year. Perhaps, the day is to commemorate the confusion. Others believe that some ancient king or emperor was tired of being the butt of every joke. As a result, the ruler made some jester "king-for-a-day" to teach the weight of the office and inspire kinder criticism. A few even believe that the fickle weather this time of year "fools" us into wondering if winter or spring is here.

No matter the origin, I agree with Mark Twain on the purpose of April Fools' Day, "This is the day upon which we are reminded of what we are on the other three hundred and sixty-four." In life, we are constantly given opportunities to look foolish, and we rarely avoid them. Of course, foolishness comes in different levels or degrees. Being a fool for an outdated fashion sense is one thing, but being a fool for prejudice or hatefulness is another. In the Scriptures, the Apostle Paul gives still us another reason to be the fool.

"Do not deceive yourselves. If you think that you are wise in this age, you should become fools so that you may become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God. For it is written, 'He catches the wise in their craftiness,' and again, 'The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile." (1 Corinthians 3: 18-20)

The follower of Jesus Christ who holds to the truth, loves his neighbor, and forgives those who slight him will look foolish to the rest of the world. Christians are supposed to be a little out of step. After all, our central claim is about a man who was crucified rose from the dead. That looks a little "foolish" to those who do not believe. The foolishness of Christ's resurrection sets us apart. For us, that foolishness is the source of our eternal joy.

For those who think they are wise, their pride often leads to arrogance. Ironically, greater wisdom is found among those who know they are fools. The poignant question remains for us: If we are fools, for what reason are we foolish? For Christ or for the world?

#### NEWS FROM THE SESSION February 2021

VBS week is June 14-18, 2021.

Forty-five people enjoyed the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper. Plan to attend the Maundy Thursday dinner on April 1st.

Maumee Valley Presbytery Mission Committee donated to Bob Sands' Inspiration Station program.

Sheriff Todd Corbin will speak at the National Day of Prayer service on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Pastor James attended the MVP meeting, a Pittsburgh Theological Seminary lecture, and a PCUSA regional Fellowship Community meeting.
